
Skilling the Territory Investment Plan 2022-23 What we have achieved

Top 5 industry groups by Government funding amount





General Skilled Migration

1200 nominations issued in the 2021-22 program year achieving 100% of the allocated quota.

NT Designated Area Migration Agreement

Signed a Deed of Variation in March 2022, providing more occupations now 124, increasing places to 625 annually and increasing concessions such as a higher age limit against some occupations.

NT Global Worker Attraction Campaign

Successfully delivered phase 1 with over 24 million users displaying campaign materials on their screen; just under 1 million online engagements and 3,150 completed job applications through Seek.

VET student count by region - top industry groups by enrolment Apprentices and trainees - number in training at 31 December 2021


